 A tool for recruiters

 An unproctored, shortened version of the AFQT that can be taken at any time, without restriction, to predict an applicant's full-length AFQT score

 Consists of 4 Arithmetic Reasoning (AR), 8 Word Knowledge (WK), 3 Paragraph Comprehension (PC), and 5 Mathematics Knowledge (MK) items

 Fast – Takes only 10-20 minutes to complete and doesn't affect an applicant's ability to take PiCAT or ASVAB

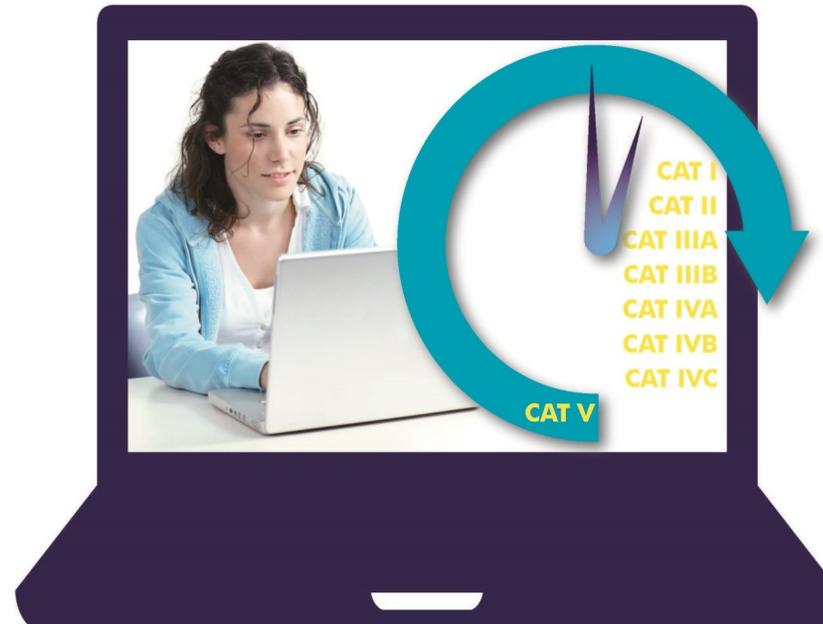
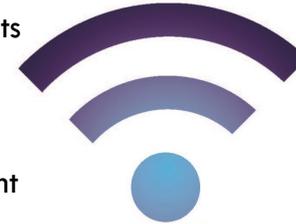
How It Works

The **APT** works like **PiCAT**

- Military recruiters use the “Authorization and Reporting” application to register applicants and look up their scores
- On any computer using Internet Explorer or Chrome browsers, applicants use the “Test Delivery” application to take the APT [<https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/icat/apt>]

Recruiters

- All recruiters and Site Security Managers (SSMs) with access to the PiCAT will automatically have access to the APT
- To gain access, contact your local SSM — in your chain of command—to request instructions and gain access to the “Authorization and Reporting” application
- Recruiters with access can register applicants to take the APT or PiCAT
- The registration process provides an access code that the recruiter gives to the applicant



Applicants

- Access codes are valid for 30 days; once an access code is used, the applicant has 48 hours to complete the test
- There is no limit on the number of times an applicant can be registered and receive an access code to take the APT

Scores

- Recruiters can access their applicant's score in the “Authorization and Reporting” application as soon as an applicant completes the APT
