He served as medical mentor embedded training team, ARSIC-N, Meymaneh Afghanistan; administrative officer and deputy state surgeon-operations/Commander, HHD Massachusetts Army National Guard Medical Command; state surgeon operations officer Massachusetts Army National Guard, Hanscom AFB; Army National Guard medical plans officer, Army National Guard Office of the Chief Surgeon at the National Guard Bureau, Arlington, VA; medical plans officer, G35 Plans, Office of the Army Surgeon General, Defense Health Headquarters, Falls Church, VA.
