Capt. Seth M. Mickelson is the commander of the Milwaukee Military Entrance Processing Station and supports the USMEPCOM mission of evaluating applicants by applying Department of Defense standards in processing and determining eligibility for military service.

He enlisted in the Army at the Minneapolis MEPS in 2011 and received his commission through Army ROTC at Minnesota State University – Mankato, Minn. in 2014.
