She enlisted in the Army at the Montgomery MEPS and attended Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. She received her commission through the Officer Basic Course as a quartermaster officer.

Major Loyd-Brown served as a platoon leader and executive officer, 512th Quartermaster Company, Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia; forward operating base mayor and logistics and personnel officer, Provisional Reconstruction Team, United States Forces-Afghanistan in Support of Operation Enduring Freedom; strength manager, 3rd Sustainment Brigade, Hunter Army Airfield; battalion human resources officer, Atlanta Recruiting Battalion, Georgia; strength manager officer, U.S. Army Central Command, Shaw Air Force Base, South Carolina, deployed as chief, G1 (Human Resources), Current Operations, G-1 Plans and Operation Division to Kuwait; the Joint Operation Command, J-1 forward mission to the American Embassy, Baghdad, transitioned to Combined Joint Task Force - Operation Inherent Resolve - J-1; reception commander, Special Operations Command, Tampa, Florida; strength manager, XVIII Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; division strength manager officer, 3rd Infantry Division, Fort Stewart, Georgia; essential personnel services officer, 3rd Infantry Division Artillery.
