Lieutenant Colonel Richard A. Szabo is the commander of the New York Military Entrance Processing Station and supports the USMEPCOM mission of evaluating applicants by applying Department of Defense standards in processing and determining eligibility for military service.

He enlisted in the North Dakota Army National Guard in 1998 and earned his commission through the Sun Devil ROTC Battalion at Arizona State University in 2000.
