Fitisemanu served as network security and training officer in charge, Computer Systems Squadron, and then executive officer, Communications Directorate, Headquarters Air Education and Training Command, Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph, Texas; requirements officer, Communications Directorate, Combined Joint Task Force – Horn of Africa, Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti; operations flight commander, 10th Intelligence Squadron, and then intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance maintenance operations branch chief, 480th Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Wing, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia; education with industry fellow, Air Force Institute of Technology, Arlington, Virginia; cyberspace fielding and logistics lead, and then weapon system sustainment deputy program manager, Air and Space Operations Center Program Office, Hanscom Air Force Base, Massachusetts; procurements branch chief, Communications Directorate, Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve, Camp Arifjan, Kuwait; director of IT and innovation, Education Support Squadron, and then flight commander and instructor, US Air Force Officer Training School, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama.
