She served as a senior instructor of international relations in the Social Science Department, United States Military Academy at West Point, New York; brigade human resource officer, 10th Combat Aviation Brigade, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, New York and deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom; battalion human resource officer, 548th Combat Support Sustainment Battalion, 10th Sustainment Brigade, 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, New York; brigade public affairs officer, 2nd Combat Aviation Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Camp Humphreys, South Korea; battalion human resource officer and battalion chemical officer, 3-2 General Support Aviation Battalion, 2nd Combat Aviation Brigade, 2nd Infantry Division, Camp Humphreys, South Korea; and battalion chemical officer, 4-1 Brigade Special Troops Battalion, 4th Brigade, 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley, Kansas.
