Lieutenant Commander Daniel S. Giller is the Commander of the Spokane Military Entrance Processing Station.

He earned his commission at Navy Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island in March 2010 and served as damage control assistant and naval surface fire support gun liaison officer aboard USS Truxtun, homeported in Norfolk, Virginia; operations officer aboard USS New York, homeported in Mayport, Florida; intelligence analyst and threat subject matter expert, Office of Naval Intelligence, Washington, District of Columbia; assistant deputy director for Flag Officer Development at the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Arlington, Virginia; and officer-in-charge at Navy Recruiting's Talent Acquisition and Onboarding Center Music City, Nashville, Tennessee. He also served on operational tours at sea with deployments to Navy's Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Fleet areas of operation as part of the George H. W. Bush Carrier Strike Group and alongside the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit as part of Navy Amphibious Squadron 8.
