Lieutenant Colonel Christopher L. Moore is the commander of 11th Battalion, United States Military Entrance Processing Command, and the St. Louis Military Entrance Processing Station.

Lieutenant Colonel Moore enlisted in the Army at the Nashville Military Entrance Processing Station in January 1995, and served as personnel management specialist, 18th Personnel Group, Fort Bragg, North Carolina; and human resources sergeant, 18th Soldier Support Group, Fort Bragg. He received his commission through Officer Candidate School in April 1999, and then served as operations officer, Headquarters, United States Army Europe, Campbell Barracks, Heidelberg, Germany; executive officer, Alpha Company, 369th Adjutant General Battalion, Fort Jackson, South Carolina; aide de camp, Soldier Support Institute, Fort Jackson; human resources officer, 369th Adjutant General Battalion, Fort Jackson; company commander, Delta Company, 369th Adjutant General Battalion, Fort Jackson; commander, U.S. Army Recruiting Company South Bend, Indiana; deployed as senior human resources and logistics advisor, 1st Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, Afghanistan; senior instructor, United States Army Recruiting and Retention School, Fort Jackson; and senior human resources officer, 3rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and deployed to Forward Operating Base Apache, Afghanistan.



Lieutenant Colonel Moore's military education includes the Brigade Human Resources Operations Course, Intermediate Level Education, Basic Instructor Training, Military Transition Team Training, Recruiting Company Commander Course, Adjutant General Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, Postal Operations Course, and the Basic Leadership Course.
