

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response

Sexual assault is intentional sexual contact characterized by

use of force, threats, intimidation, or abuse of authority or when the victim does not or cannot consent. The term includes a broad category of sexual offenses consisting of, but not limited to the following: rape, sexual assault, aggravated sexual contact, abusive sexual contact, forcible sodomy (forced oral or anal sex), or attempts to commit these acts.

Sexual assault is a crime and does not have a place in the U.S. Armed Forces. Reporting a sexual assault does not disqualify you from joining the Military.

If you have been sexually assaulted or harassed at any time while processing for the U.S. Armed Forces, you are encouraged to report the incident to the nearest MEPS employee. That employee should immediately contact the MEPS Commander or someone in the Chain of Command. All complaints will be investigated.

Should you elect to join the armed forces, you will soon learn the safety and security of your unit, your ship or your aircraft is a vital concern of military operations.

- Report crime
- Report injury

Here are some things you need to be aware of while processing at the MEPS:

- No guns, knives or weapons of any type.
- No alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia.
- Do not bring valuables or large sums of cash with you to the MEPS.
- No horseplay or any behavior that may be disruptive or injure others.
- No profanity.
- Pay close attention to all instructions given by MEPS personnel.
- Obey all MEPS procedures.
- At no time are you required to tip or pay for transportation or services.

At the Hotel:

- Do not give out personal information over the telephone. MEPS or recruiting personnel will NOT call asking questions.
- Do not give out your room number to those you do not know.
- **Do not** invite anyone into your room.
- Do not accept anyone else's invitation to his/her room.
- Do not swim alone in the hotel pool.
- Keep your room key or key card with you at all times.
- Read and follow all posted hotel security rules.
- Avoid "pre-shipping out" parties.
- If you go out, be aware of your surroundings and enter the hotel through the main lobby area.

At the Airport:

- Report any suspicious activity while in the MEPS or at the hotel.
- Be on time.
- Follow all airport and airline security rules.
- Never volunteer to "watch" the baggage of someone you do not know.
- Maintain physical contact with your baggage at all times.
